

1. The Grant holder and any other person or persons nominated by the Grant holder or their representative shall have exclusive right to the site.
2. No burial or placement of cremated remains shall take place until a valid Grant has been produced.
3. A transfer can occur at any time while the Grant is current.
4. To perform a transfer, it is necessary to complete a Transfer of Grant Declaration and provide the required documentation.
5. The Grant holder's may be transferred upon the death or legal incapacity of the Grant holder to any one of the following people in descending order of entitlement:
  - a. the sole executor or administrator of the Grant holder
  - b. the sole beneficiary
  - c. a joint executor or administrator (with permission from all others) of the Grant holder
  - d. the spouse of the Grant holder (including a putative or common law spouse)
  - e. the eldest living and legally capable child of the Grant holder
  - f. the eldest living and legally capable grandchild of the Grant holder
  - g. the eldest living and legally capable sibling of the Grant holder
  - h. the eldest living and legally capable blood relative of the Grant holder the Authority deems legally capable to be 18 years of age or more.
6. The Grant may be extended at any time during the tenure of the Grant in one year increments for a minimum period of five years to a maximum tenure period of 99 years.
7. When the Grant tenure has expired, a new Grant may be issued for a minimum tenure period as determined by the Authority up to a maximum tenure period of 99 years, subject to the applicant meeting the relevant requirements of the Authority's Burial & Cremation Grants Policy and payment of the prescribed fee.
8. All monument decoration work, installation or inscription must be undertaken by a monumental mason approved to work in the Authority's cemeteries.
9. Tributes placed on burial and memorial sites must comply with Adelaide Cemeteries Authority's Flower Policy.
10. The care and maintenance of monuments and grave decorations is the right and responsibility of the Grant holder.
11. West Terrace Cemetery is included on the State Heritage Register (Item 10891). As a State Heritage place, all development, including the installation, conservation and repair of monuments, is subject to heritage criteria and approval by the Heritage Branch of the Environment and Heritage Department.
12. Unless otherwise advised, burial sites at Cheltenham Cemetery are developed from pre-used sites where the Grants have expired. Such development is undertaken in accordance with the Authority's Operating Policies.
13. The rights granted are subject to compliance by the Grant holder with all the rules and regulations established under the relevant Acts and the Authority's Operating Policies as varied from time to time.
14. Grant holders are responsible for advising the Authority of a change of address.
